College Scholarships

Through the generosity of various College stakeholders, the College is able to offer four Scholarships to current Year 10 students and one Scholarship to current Year 8 students, which will contribute to the costs of schooling for the subsequent two years at St Edward's. Applications for these will open to Year 8 and Year 10 students in Term 4 of each year, for the following year. Year 10 Applicants are able to apply for more than one scholarship. The terms and conditions of each scholarship are listed below.

College Board Scholarship (Year 10)

1. That the student be of above average academic ability demonstrated by performance and potential. Reports will be reviewed.
2. That the applicant has demonstrated the potential and work ethic required from a senior student.
3. That the applicant has made some contribution to the life of St Edward's, in the past, or could in the future in some area of endeavour (cultural, sporting etc).
4. That the family is willing to co-operate with the ethos, and policies of this Catholic school.
5. The scholarship will cover \$3000 annually toward the tuition fees of the successful applicant. Remaining tuition fees, specialist subject fees, service fees, sporting fees and building fund contributions remain the responsibility of the family.

Catholic Women's League Scholarship (Year 10)

1. That the family of the applicant would normally be unable to pay all the usual tuition and book fees, and would otherwise have found it financially difficult to continue his enrolment at the College in senior years.
2. That the applicant belongs to a Catholic family which is actively involved in the Catholic community. That the family is willing to co-operate with the ethos, and policies of this Catholic school.
3. That the applicant has demonstrated the potential and work ethic required from a senior student.
4. The student will be required to make a short presentation at the CWL Annual Lunch towards the end of the year. This is designed to present his achievements and goals to the sponsors of the Scholarship.

5. The scholarship will contribute \$1000 annually in Year 11 and 12 toward the tuition fees of the successful applicant. Remaining tuition fees, specialist subject fees, service fees, sporting fees and building fund contributions remain the responsibility of the family.

Blessed Edmund Rice Scholarship (P&F) (Year 10)

1. That the student be of above average academic ability, demonstrated by performance and potential. Reports will be reviewed.
2. That the applicant has demonstrated the potential and work ethic required from a senior student.
3. That the applicant has made some contribution to the life of St Edward's in the past, or could in the future, in some area of endeavour (cultural, sporting etc).
4. That the family is willing to co-operate with the ethos and policies of this Catholic School.
5. If the Principal and P&F Executive Committee find it difficult to choose between a number of students, family financial need would be considered.
6. The Scholarship will cover \$1000 annually towards the tuition fees of the successful applicant. Remaining tuition fees, specialist subject fees, service fees, sport fees and Building Fund contributions remain the responsibility of the family.

College Sporting Scholarship (Year 10)

1. This scholarship is an effort to support a student and his family where sporting talent has been obvious or potential is obvious. It should be that the applicant has shown sporting expertise in one or more sports at an above average level and represented the College in his area of sport.
2. That the applicant has demonstrated the potential and work ethic required from a senior student and has the academic ability to complete two years of senior schooling to their potential while keeping their sporting participation active.
3. That the applicant has made some contribution to the life of St Edward's, in the past, or could in the future in the sporting arena, or other area of endeavour.
4. That the family is willing to co-operate with the ethos and policies of this Catholic school.
5. The scholarship will cover \$3000 annually toward the tuition fees of the successful applicant. Remaining tuition fees, specialist subject fees, service fees, sporting fees and building fund contributions remain the responsibility of the family.

Judy Skeahan Bequest Part Scholarship (Year 8)

1. Through the generosity of Mrs Judy Skeahan, the Gosford Conference of the St Vincent de Paul Society has offered the College a part-scholarship which is open to one student who is currently in Year 8.
2. Consideration will be given to an applicant's academic effort and application, participation in school events, parish and community life and general family circumstances.
3. That the family of the applicant would normally be unable to pay all the usual tuition and book fees.
4. That the applicant belongs to a Catholic family which is actively involved in the Catholic community. That the family is willing to co-operate with the ethos, and policies of this Catholic school.
5. That the applicant has demonstrated the potential and work ethic required. Continuation of the Scholarship into Year 10 will be subject to review at the completion of Year 9.
6. The scholarship will cover \$1000 annually towards the tuition fees of the successful applicant over the two years. Specialist subject fees, service fees, sporting fees, remainder tuition fees and building fund contributions remain the responsibility of the family.

If all the above sees it difficult to choose between a number of students, family financial need could be considered. Should the Principal and/or relevant committees find it difficult to separate applicants it may be recommended that two or several half scholarships be offered. The scholarship amount will be deducted in the first billing period each year. The student and parents should complete their sections of the application form below, save the document then submit via email.
