## WATERFORD PROJECT

A compulsory requirement for all students in Year 8 – 11 at St Edward's is the '**See, Judge, Act**' program. This involves students completing a minimum of 15 hours of service in the home and/or local community by the end of Term 3. Our overall purpose is to follow the genuine Christian example of Blessed Edmund Rice, founder of the world wide order of Christian Brothers in Waterford, Ireland 200 years ago. We believe students will have the opportunity to learn to be young Christian men and to express their Catholic faith via action in observing social needs. Many students already do this so to that extent it may simply reinforce or confirm the good Christian actions they provide for others. We hope that St Edward's College students have a strong sense of values by the time they leave our college – love, compassion, service and faith.

Your son will be presented with a booklet which contains all information regarding the program.
